(curt)

Here.

She hands him a Xeroxed sheet.

WALLY

What's this?

ALICE

Government Code Sections 12940 A, H and J.

WALLY:

(Reading) "Guidelines on Sexual Harassment in the Workplace".

ALICE

You think I don't know what you were doing?

WALLY

What was I doing?

ALICE

Number Four.

WALLY

(Reads) Leering.

ALICE

You're creating an offensive, gender-biased atmosphere that threatens my civil rights. Consider this a warning.

WALLY

Alice, just for the record, how is learning measurable?

ALICE HOLDS UP A STOPWATCH.

ALICE

Any look over three seconds without meaningful verbal content is obviously for the wanton pleasure of male viewers.

SHE TAKES A THREATENING STEP TOWARD WALLY.

WALLY

(Looks down, panicked)

I swear I've never had any pleasure viewing you.

ALICE CONSIDERS FOR A BEAT

ALICE

(GRUFF) Thank you.

SHE STARTS TO STALK OFF. WALLY IMMEDIATELY LOOKS DOWN AT HIS DESK TO AVOID HER EYES.

WALLY

And I wasn't wearing my glasses. Without them, I can barely see.

ALICE

"Barely" That's an unusual choice of words. Would you have said "barely" to refer to an incident involving a male co-worker?

WALLY

Excuse me. What I meant to say is I can't see without my glasses.

ALICE

Prove it. (pause) Can you prove that you can't see without your glasses?

WALLY

I can get a note from my eye doctor.

ALICE

You don't think I can find a medical expert to discredit you? How many fingers am I holding up?

WALLY

I don't know.

ALICE

You're lying. It's your word against mine.

WALLY

Why are you doing this?

ALICE

I have a dream that one day gender will no longer be an issue in the workplace.

You know how you can tell the men and the women apart in the engineering department today?

WALLY

(panicked) You can tell them apart?
