INT. DOCTOR'S OFFICE - DAY

FINN

When did you start treating her?

DR. WILSON

About nine months ago. Her mother
brought her to me after synthetic
medicines had failed her daughter
miserably.

As they enter his office --

FINN

Her mother told you Emma had already
been diagnosed with cancer?

DR. WILSON

Not that she had to, it was obvious.
With any cancer, there's a profound
electromagnetic disturbance to the
body. If correctly altered, it would
enable a solid chance at recovery.

FINN

You mean radiation?

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DR. WILSON

Heavens, no. Acupuncture, along with
some nutritional and metabolic
therapies effective in treating cancer.

Finn looks at the bullshit holistic diplomas on his wall --

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DR. WILSON

FINN

I'll wait.

As Dr. Wilson picks up the phone to call his assistant --

EXT. COFFEE CART - DAY

Rossi's cell rings as she pays for a coffee. She checks the number, hits the ignore button and catches up to Steele --

STEELE

Not gonna answer that?

ROSSI

Later.

STEELE

Business or pleasure?

ROSSI

I have a life, you know.

She fixes the back of his collar --

STEELE

What?

ROSSI

Tie was showing

STEELE

(softens)

How's your case?

ROSSI

So far so good.

STEELE

Got enough for the indictment?

ROSSI

Just waiting on Cabot to sign off.

STEELE

Get it in, we can issue an arrest by the end of the day.

ROSSI

I haven't been able to catch her all day.

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
